Wanderers Return Assistance Program (W.R.A.P.)

The purpose of this program is to provide an identification kit to be used by families and other care givers of citizens with Alzheimer 's disease or dementia who might be subject to wandering.

The kit consists of an identification form with a current picture of the individual, an area for a DNA sample, a

bracelet and ID card.

The form and ID card, with the photo, will have very descriptive information as to the individual as well as contact information and is to be retained by the family or caretaker.

This form can be given to law enforcement personnel in the advent of the disappearance of the concerned individual and will aid in the identification and return of that person.

The bracelet has a water tight compartment and contains a brief identification as

well as family and caregiver information and contact numbers. It is to be worn by the senior.

The identification brochure and bracelet, with insert, are to be completed with the help of the family or caretaker and kept wherever the individual resides.

This service is provided to the public at no cost to the individual, family or caregiver.
